

FIPs must now demonstrate they have a **public policy statement**outlining their commitment to respect human and labor rights

FIPs must now ensure fishers are aware of the FIP's public policy statement.

1.1 Policy Statement | Overview

What is a policy statement?

A documented agreement a FIP and/or its participants employ to publicly disclose responsibilities, commitments, and/or expectations regarding, at a minimum, human rights and social responsibility.

Minimum criteria:

- ✓ Apply to all vessels and fishers fishing, whether on shore or on a vessel, and transporting catch of FIP product
- ✓ Address 12 specific categories corresponding to select SRA indicators
- ✓ Be endorsed by the relevant party or parties in the FIP
- ✓ Be active throughout the time the FIP is active on FisheryProgress
- ✓ Be shared with all FIP participants in the language(s) they understand

Minimum criteria:

✓ Apply to all vessels and fishers fishing, whether on shore of FIP product

We do not require how you must address these categories, but FP strongly encourages that FIPs take a firm stance on mitigating and eliminating HR abuses.

Minimum criteria:

- ✓ Apply to all vessels and fishers fishing, wh FIP product
- ✓ Address 12 specific categories correspond

A few options:

- The FIP lead(s) signs a Policy Statement on behalf of the FIP supply chain participants OR
- Each FIP supply chain participant signs a Policy Statement OR
- Each FIP supply chain participant has a Policy Statement published on their company's website

- ✓ Be endorsed by the relevant party or parties in the FIP
- ✓ Be active throughout the time the FIP is active on FisheryProgress
- ✓ Be shared with all FIP participants in the language(s) they understand

1.3 Fisher Awareness of Rights | Requirement details

Make fishers aware of their rights:

- Commitments and responsibilities outlined in the FIP's policy statement
- The availability of grievance mechanisms and how to use them








