HS is responsive to the state of the stocks and ensure the implementation of robust HCRs by working with institutions and other overlapping tuna fisheries




Collate information on bycatch and ETP species interactions, ensuring minimal impacts and strengthen management strategies where necessary



Strengthen governance in flag and coastal states relating to the fishery



To achieve an MSC certifiable status by 2025.



## Fishery Assessment results



#### **Principle 1**

Stocks status is good for all target stocks

Lack of well-defined HCR and responsive harvest strategies are issues



#### **Principle 2**

Lack of information on the ETP species interactions

Need for ETP species management for some species



#### **Principle 3**

Lack of information and possibly poorly managed flag states on the high seas

## Hangton FIP Action Plan

These shortcomings have been used to build the action plan; these actions we must complete to be able to pass MSC assessment.

These are split by Principle.



## Principle 1: Sustainability of Target Stocks

For all stocks, the harvest strategy should allow maximum sustainable catch and well-defined HCRs.

These associated actions are targeted at WCPFC. The FIP shall have an advocacy role in conjunction with the coastal and flag States.

The FIP can engage with flag states and coastal states to:

- Propose practical ways to support the process, i.e. via liaison with other fisheries, NGOs and flag and coastal states;
- Request that delegates to support harvest strategy development process at RFMO meetings.

The FIP can also prepare position papers and statements on harvest strategies and send to WCPFC.

### Principle 2: Minimising environmental impacts

The pre-assessment was based purely on catch data, but volumes of 'other' species were not provided.

This meant that it was not possible to accurately assess 'secondary species and 'ETP species' PIs

This led to precautionary scoring in the pre-assessment and associated actions in the workplan.







# Principle 3 – Effective Management

More information regarding flag and coastal state management is needed, including:

- Identify all relevant stakeholders for the fishery;
- Fishery-specific roles and responsibilities and decision-making processes;
- Fishery-specific MCS in place

**Positive**: There are MSC certified tuna fisheries with China as a flag state and for the Solomon Islands (coastal state), which provides confidence that management is sufficient to pass MSC certification for those countries.
