Further to my email of yesterday I am pleased to confirm that the GFW Latin America team have interest in exploring with you to understand how our technology and analytical support can contribute to FIPs

implementation/assessments and other certification processes.

Claudino is one of the GFW and confirmed that the Associated School is a new fishing area recently regulated in Brazil. There are 176 vessels using VMS and we can see in the map. In the current filter by gear type this fleet was classified as 'fishing', and this activity can be a mix of different gear types. but this fishery takes place in open seas in a very clear zone. In addition to confirming that the vessel can be seen on the GFW, Claudino has also prepared a workspace that represents this fleet, link below, and when you click on the link, he has put a polygon around the fishing ground so that you can see it clearly. Any fishing activity that you can see outside of the polygon is not associated school fishing. The GFW analysis team are working to improve the filter.https://globalfishingwatch.org/map/fishing-activity/associated_school-user-public and any feedback from yourselves on the value of the data provided by GFW in this workspace would be appreciated.
