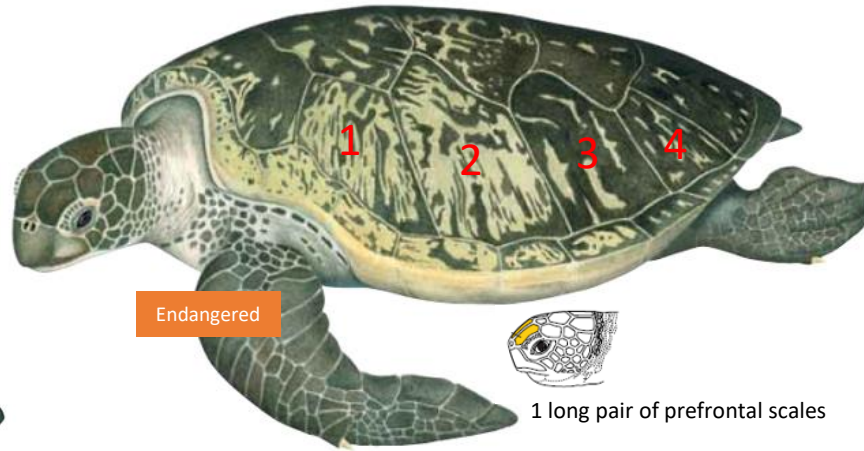
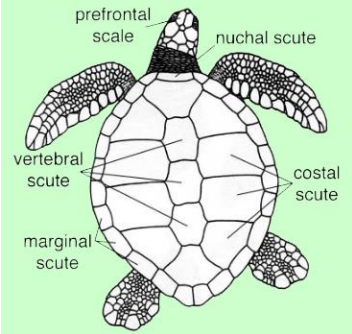


Commonly Encountered Sea Turtles Species



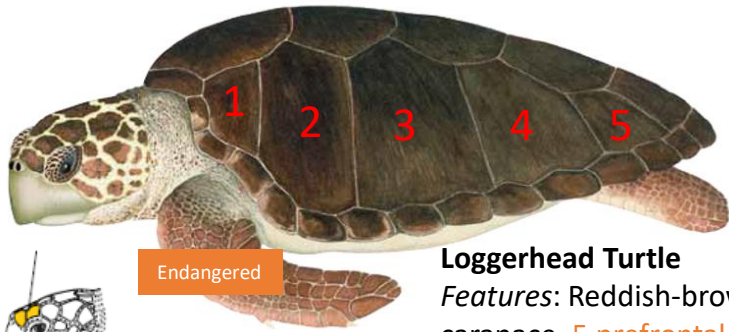
Green Turtle

Features: olive-green carapace with black spots in adults (> 90 cm); brick red with a few streaks in sub-adults (15–90 cm). **1 long pair of prefrontal scales. 4 pairs of costal scutes.**



Olive Ridley Turtle

Features: Green to dark brownish-green carapace. **2 pairs of prefrontal scales. 5 or more pairs of costal scutes.**



Loggerhead Turtle

Features: Reddish-brown to orange-brown carapace. **5 prefrontal scales; single one in between 2 pairs. 5 pairs of costal scutes.**



Leatherback Turtle

Features: Whole body similar colour, bluish-back with white spots. The animal does not have scales.

*Most of the turtle's encountered are listed as at least vulnerable by the IUCN.
