# 1. Template letter from NAPA members to NE Atlantic Coastal State Fishery Ministers

To: Fishery Minister

[Insert company name] have made public commitments to sourcing seafood, including mackerel, Atlanto-Scandian herring and blue whiting [include as needed] from the North East Atlantic, responsibly. As one of the decision-makers in the management of these fisheries we are calling on you to take the following actions and show leadership. We need your support to improve the sustainability of these fisheries.

We are alarmed by the continuing dispute over quota allocation of these species resulting in annual catches well in excess of the advised quota. The agreed quotas for 2021 reveal that ICES advice is being exceeded by 42% for mackerel, 39% for Atlanto-Scandian herring and 30% for blue whiting.

This is having <u>major implications</u> for our business. The mismanagement of these fisheries has so far resulted in the loss of Marine Stewardship Council (MSC) certification. Loss of certification implies that fisheries are no longer publicly recognised against well-known independent certification programs for fisheries sustainability. Furthermore, blue whiting has lost MarinTrust certification - which is conditional on MSC certification. The knock-on effect on the biggest customer of the fishery, salmon aquaculture, is a significant step back in responsible business practice and will impact retailer and foodservice companies, as well as consumers, who demand sustainable marine ingredients in feed.

The issue is entirely political; Coastal States merely need to agree on catch shares that follow the ICES advice.

Commitments to sustainable fishing have also been made by all Coastal States involved in North East Atlantic fisheries through the adoption of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), in particular SDG 14 on 'life below water'. For convenience SDG 14.4 states:

by 2020, effectively regulate harvesting, and end overfishing, illegal, unreported and unregulated (IUU) fishing and destructive fishing practices and implement science-based management plans, to restore fish stocks in the shortest time feasible at least to levels that can produce maximum sustainable yield as determined by their biological characteristics

We also have SDG related targets and objectives, and certification offers a credible impartial tool to demonstrate we meet our ambitions to contribute to a healthy planet for future generations. Loss of certification would reduce our progress against the SDGs.

#### Week 1 (w/c 20th September): THE PROBLEM WITH PELAGICS:

With 1 month to go until the Coastal State negotiations on the management of mackerel, herring & blue whiting, we are starting the #CountdowntoCoastalStates. Over the next month, we'll detail the critical importance of these negotiations for the #sustainability of key #pelagics.



#Pelagic stocks extend across a number of Exclusive Economic Zones & into international waters. This creates a number of #management challenges for how catch limits are set & monitored. #CountdowntoCoastalStates





There is no agreed mechanism for sharing mackerel, herring & blue whiting quotas, causing catch allowances to be exceeded year on year. #Scientific advice is ignored, challenging #cooperative & #sustainable management. #CountdowntoCoastalStates



Coastal State quotas for 2021 reveal that @ICES\_ASC advice is being exceeded by 30-40% for all 3 #pelagic stocks - NE Atlantic mackerel, herring & blue whiting. This is an \*unacceptable\* threat to shared-stock #fisheries. #CountdowntoCoastalStates





A lack of cooperation & #fishing agreements between Coastal States led to loss of @MSCecolabel certification in 2019-20. NAPA members committed to sourcing #sustainable #seafood are being thwarted by #certification loss. #CountdowntoCoastalStates



#### Week 2 (w/c 27th September): ORIGIN OF NAPA:

NAPA was launched in 2020 in response to loss of @MSCecolabel certification for mackerel, herring & blue whiting. We are a retail-led initiative: a shared & non-competitive solution to #sustainability issues in #pelagic #fisheries. #CountdowntoCoastalStates

Only 2 weeks until Coastal States negotiate management agreements for NE Atlantic mackerel, herring & blue whiting. So far, our #CountdowntoCoastalStates has touched on the problem with #pealgics & the origin of NAPA, but what does the science say? Come back tomorrow to find out.



Agreed quotas for 2021 reveal that @ICES\_ASC advice for 3 key #pelagic stocks - NE Atlantic mackerel, herring & blue whiting - is being exceeded by 30-40%. We are seeing the tragedy of the commons played out in real-time. #CountdowntoCoastalStates





Despite unilateral quota setting by Coastal States, mackerel, herring & blue whiting stocks are not yet in crisis. Loss of @MSCecolabel certification was driven by #political factors rather than concerns for stock biomass. #CountdowntoCoastalStates



#### Week 4 (w/c 11th October): NAPA's PLAN OF ACTION

To address the governance issues affecting mackerel & herring, we set up a policy FIP to drive political will for cooperative decision-making, sustainable quota agreements & robustly managed #fisheries. #CountdowntoCoastalStates https://buff.ly/3g8cvGR


